The Association was welcomed to Baldwin Fire Department by Chief of Department Bill Dworsak. President Tucholski thanked him and those who helped out with tonight's meal for hosting our meeting tonight.

Awards: First Vice President Kevin McElynn gave the following report:

1. We have 2 Firematic awards this year to be presented at the dinner.
2. The awards committee will have to meet following the Re-Org meeting to review documents and look at new ideas for this committee.

Burn Center: First Vice President McElynn asked if there was any update on the status of the Burn Center at NUMC, which started a lengthy discussion on this topic.

Dinner: Past President Richard Messina reported that the 2023 Installation Dinner will be at the Crescent Beach Club in Bayville on **TUESDAY** June 6th, with the cocktail hour starting at 6:30 PM – tickets are \$80 per person. 1. Our last meeting was on April 23rd at the Garden City Park Fire Department. There were 147 juniors present. Three-star retired FDNY Chief James Daly spoke about his journey from a junior firefighter in the Farmingdale Fire Department to a FDNY Chief.
2. We held a food drive for the Nassau County veteran's food pantry and will be delivering it in the coming week.
3. We had another extended training session on April 30th at the FSA. There were 33 Juniors present to take part in 2 evolutions. One squad took extinguishers while the other was on the 2nd floor of the tower knocking down a room fire. We had such a positive feedback on the tower, we spoke to Chief Hughes and Chief Wilders and we are adding it to the curriculum of the camp. Just in case you were not able to make to this past one, we are having another training session in the fall.

1. All applications have been sent out for Camp Fahrenheit 516 taking place July 24th to July 28th from 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM at the FSA. Please get all applications back to the training committee ASAP.
2. The Hempstead Fire Department has started a Junior Firefighter program and they will be joining the NCJFA.
3. Junior groups in Nassau County have received many awards for 2023. Syosset Advisor Roshan Mathai received the FASNY Mentor of the Year, Junior Firefighter and current NCJFA President Kyra Kozy of Syosset Fire Department Juniors won the NVFC Junior Firefighter of the Year, and the East Norwich Junior Fire Department won both the FASNY and NVFC Junior Youth Group of the Year.
4. Our next meeting will be held on June 4th at the Hicksville Fire Department Station 3, which is our Annual BBQ lunch meeting at 11:00 AM – all are welcome.

Fire Police: John Wicks gave the following report:

He also reported that Governor Hochul wanted to have firefighters paid by call for the volunteer firefighters, but that didn't pass in the state budget.
